

For 2014 the toll collection exceeded 183 million Euros

Bratislava, 21 January 2015 – For December 2014 the toll collection amounted to 12.66 million Euros. For the whole year 2014 the National Motorway Company earned 183.39 million Euros. In 2014 as many as 57,695 vehicles became entitled to a toll rate discount, of which 44,845 came from Slovakia. For the five years of the ETC system operation the total amount collected was 793.84 million Euros.

The specified sections of motorways and expressways earned 8.1 million Euros on toll collection in December 2014. The specified sections of 1st class roads earned 4.56 million Euros. The share of the parallel roads of the toll collection on 1st class roads in December was 11.3 percent (0.51 million Euros). Of the total amount of tolls collected in December 42.9 percent was paid by foreign vehicle operators. The day of the month with the highest toll collection was 8th December when the collected amount reached 712,965 Euros. In December the specified road sections were daily used by 27,737 unique vehicles over 3.5 tons on average.

The specified sections of motorways and expressways earned 113.56 million Euros on toll collection in 2014. The specified sections of 1st class roads earned 69.74 million Euros for the whole year. Foreign hauliers paid 42.9 percent of the total amount collected for the year 2014. Among the foreign users of the specified road sections the highest amount was paid in 2014, just as in the previous years, by vehicles from Poland (17.4 %), the Czech Republic (8.2 %) and Hungary (5.2 %). In terms of the payment modes, the revenues under the prepaid toll mode had a share of the total annual toll collection of 68.4 percent. The biggest share of the amount collected in 2014 was achieved by hauliers using vehicles in the weight category of over 12 tons with two axles, which paid 141.63 million Euros. That was 77.2 percent of the total annual toll collection. In terms of emission classes the biggest share of the toll collection was achieved by vehicles of EURO III, IV class together with IV+ class, which still has not been re-registered, with 83.71 million Euros and a share of 45.6 percent.

As at 31 December 2014 there were 246,912 OBUs registered in the electronic toll system. Of these 72.1 percent was used by foreign vehicles. In 2014 the specified road sections were daily used by 31,969 unique vehicles over 3.5 tons on average. Compared to 2013 their number increased by 13.1 percent. In the course of 2014 the electronic toll system was used by 329,972 unique vehicles equipped with the On-Board Unit. In the previous year it was 292,948 vehicles.

The highest amount of toll, 7.4 million Euros, was collected on the specified section of the motorway D02-008 in both directions: Kúty 1 – Malacky for 1.74 million crossings. In terms of the number of vehicles that crossed in both directions, in 2014, just as in the previous year, the busiest motorway section with 2.46 million crossings was D02-004: Petržalka 1 – Petržalka 2, which collected tolls in the amount of 2.97 million Euros. The highest toll collection on expressways was achieved by the section R01-022: Žiar nad Hronom- Šášovské Podhradie - Hronská Breznica. In 2014 the section was crossed by vehicles liable to pay tolls 1.01 million times and the drivers crossing in both directions paid 1.63 million Euros in total. The busiest specified section on expressways was the section R01-002: Trnava - Modranka – Trnava - Modranka with 0.99 million crossings and the collected amount of

0.21 million Euros. The specified section of the 1st class roads with the highest toll collection in 2014 was 018-026a: Strečno 2 - (MK-a, I/18) with the collected amount of 1.17 million Euros for 1.29 million crossings in both directions. The specified section 011-013: Žilina-north – Žilina-Brodno 2 was the busiest among the 1st class road sections. It collected 0.24 million Euros for 1.47 million crossings in both directions.

In the course of last year the mobile enforcement units dealt with 6,574 cases of violation of Act on Electronic Toll Collection on the specified road sections. They collected tolls from the checked drivers in the amount of 91.43 thousand Euros. The share of Slovak vehicle operators of the total offences committed was 24.2%.

In 2014 SkyToll recorded 182 the total of justified submissions in terms of the electronic toll collection operation. These included 161 claims, 15 requests and 7 suggestions. The number of justified submissions decreased year-to-year by 75. Also in 2014 all the received submissions were handled within 5 working days.

In 2014 the customer service line received 63.3 thousand calls. Drivers most often inquired about general questions regarding the toll system and the related legislation (13.7 thousand calls). The second spot was held by information regarding the OBU return (10.6 thousand calls) and the third spot by the OBU settings (8.8 thousand calls). The toll web portal recorded 650.4 thousand visitors, most of them, almost 444.2 thousand, were from Slovakia.
