

Toll collection for the first half of 2015 reached 91.5 million Euros

Bratislava, 15 July 2015 – **The complex service of electronic toll collection earned 17.01 million Euros for the National Motorway Company in June 2015. For the first half of 2015 the toll collection reached 91.47 million Euros. Since the start of 2015 as many as 17,935 vehicles became entitled to a toll rate discount, of which 14,897 from Slovakia.**

The specified sections of motorways and expressways earned 10.65 million Euros on toll collection in June. Compared to May it was 0.83 million Euros (8.5 percent) more. For the first 6 months of 2015 in the same road category toll collection reached 58.25 million Euros. The specified sections of 1st class roads earned 6.36 million Euros in June, which compared to May was 0.5 million (8.5 percent) more. Toll collection for the first half of the year on 1st class roads reached 33.18 million Euros. Of the total amount collected in June almost 42.4 % was paid by foreign vehicle operators. The share of foreign vehicle operators of the total toll collection for the first half of the year was 43.4 percent. The day of the month with the highest toll collection was 1st June, when the government earned 748,794 Euros. The day of the first six months with the highest toll collection was 11th May with 758,436 Euros.

As at 30 June 2015 there were 251,868 OBUs registered in the electronic toll system. Compared to the previous month their number increased by 2,213 units. Of the registered OBUs 72.3 percent were used by foreign vehicles. In June the specified road sections were daily used by 38,993 vehicles on average, which represented a month-to-month increase of 4,403 (12.7 percent).

In the course of June the mobile enforcement units dealt with 607 cases of violation of Act on Electronic Toll Collection on the specified road sections. They collected tolls from checked drivers in the amount of 6,347 Euros. Toll collection from drives who violated the ETC Act for the first half of the year reached 36,932 Euros.

In June SkyToll recorded the total of 16 justified submissions by customers concerning the electronic toll collection operation. These included 15 claims and 1 request. All the received submissions were handled within the deadline set out in the contract with the National Motorway Company, which is 5 working days.

Operators of the customer service line of the electronic toll system received 5.3 thousand calls in June. The toll web portal recorded 53.6 thousand visits for the same month.

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
